SMA members include Dietitians, Doctors, Exercise Scientists, Orthopaedic Surgeons, Physicians, Physiotherapists, Podiatrists, Psychologists, Public Health professionals, Soft Tissue Therapists, Sports Trainers as well as nurses, teachers and parents.

Professional Education

Australian Conference of Science and Medicine in Sport (ACSMS).

Held annually in October, the ACSMS is the largest multidisciplinary sports science and sports medicine conference held in the southern hemisphere. It provides an interactive educational forum for the exchange of knowledge and information about research, practices and products in the field.

State professional development courses

SMA state branches provide multi-disciplinary courses, seminars and workshops covering all areas and levels of sports medicine. SMA-ACT branch run an annual conference, South East Regonial Conference of Science and Medicine in Sport on the first weekend in February every year. Contact our office for details.

Publications

SMA members receive the following publications and a range of communications from their state branch.

Journal of Science And Medicine in Sport (JSAMS)

Published every two months from 2006, JSAMS is the major refereed research publication on sports science and medicine in Australia. It provides high quality, original research papers to keep members and subscribers informed of developments in sports science and medicine. (Full members only)

Sport Health Magazine

Published quarterly, this magazine is both for members and the general public. It covers topical issues within all areas of sport and physical activity and also the interests and activities of the individual sports science and medicine disciplines.

Published for Sports Trainers, the STD covers topical issues and helps keep trainers up to date on sports medicine and science as it relates to their role in sports safety.

Member/Professional Education Program

The ACT Branch of Sport Medicine Australia runs workshops, seminars and courses for health professionals with an interest and working in, areas related to sports medicine and sports science, health promotion and physical activity.

Each year a calendar of events is constructed and publicised by direct mail to members and affiliated organisations as well as via the SMA (ACT Branch) website http://act.sma.orq.au.

The Community Education Program

The "Safer Sport Program" Community Education Program is the principle community education activity conducted by Sports Medicine Australia (ACT Branch).

It is a goal of the Safer Sport Program to reach all participants in the active community, thereby producing greater awareness of prevention of sports injury techniques and immediate injury assessment, management and referral of sporting injuries.

With an increased participation rate in sport and physical activity, a greater Sport Safe culture will ensure a decreased frequency and severity of injuries associated in sport and physical activity at all levels of competition.

SMA (ACT Branch) is committed to the "Safer Sport Program" message by providing nationally accredited courses, school-based courses, community seminars, resource development, sports specific courses and club-based workshops.

Workshops and short courses are tailor made for clubs, schools or recreation centres aimed at coaches, athletics, team managers, parents, teachers, and nurses. Education can focus on one particular sport and it's common injuries or on a wide variety of sports medicine topics.

In order to keep up to date with the latest sports medicine trends, issues and research, SMA (ACT Branch) presents seminars, conferences and workshops for sports trainers, coaches, players, parents and physical education teachers. All seminars and conferences provide participants with the practical skills to prevent and immediately manage common sports injuries.

Safer Sport Nationally Accredited Courses

CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) HLTCPR201A \$50

The Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) recommend that the CPR component of First Aid be refreshed every 12 months. Fitness Australia enforces this recommendation for all of its members. This course covers the unit of competency required to perform CPR in line with the ARC guidelines.

Sports First Aid (Apply First Aid) HLTFA301B \$150

This is a one day course, Workcover approved and equivalent to a Senior First Aid Course. The course is aimed at equipping parents, coaches, and first aiders to act as the first responder to any first aid emergency. Upon successful completion, a 3 year first aid accreditation will be provided along with a statement of attainments which is available in PDF or printer version to enable participants to maintain a record and forward their accreditation via email.

SMA undertakes all the first aid training at CIT, and has a strong lecture base which provides flexible and tailored learning for any group. Contact our office for further details or send an enquiry to act@sma.org.au

Advanced Resuscitation \$140

This course provides participants with training in advanced first aid resuscitation techniques, life support and management of casualty(s) using Oxygen in resuscitation and oxygen therapy. Advanced Resuscitation has both practical and theoretical elements, where participants demonstrate procedures of techniques used and exhibit the necessary knowledge on administering advanced first aid.

Level One Sport Trainer \$285

The Level 1 Sports Trainer will learn about prevention of injuries and initial sports injury management. ACT Branch runs this course over 21 hours. A prerequisite for this course is a current first aid certificate. For further details and the course outline visit **http://act.sma.orq.au** safer sport education.

Level Two Sports Trainer \$285

This course is a progression from the level 1 sports trainers course. It is designed to build upon the skills learnt in the level 1 sports trainers course. Coupled with industry experience, the course also contains modules that aim to improve trainers skills and knowledge of the provision of first aid and sports medicine services. Prerequisite of current first aid, Level 1 and 50 hours practical work with a club or organisation. For further details visit http://act.sma.org.au safer sport education.

CPR refresher

Re-accreditation is offered for Sports First Aid, CPR, Level 1 Sports Trainer and Level 2 Sports Trainer. Participants who hold accreditation for first aid with another organisation can apply for their first aid update with Sports Medicine Australia at the above rate.

CPR and first aid courses are available in the workplace or to any group upon request.

Level 2 sports trainers need to undertake 3 professional development sessions to qualify for re-accreditation and should contact our office to discuss.

Safer Sport Workshops

Sports Medicine Workshops

A 1 or 2 hour workshop can be designed to suit the needs of your school or club covering topics such as injury prevention and management.

Sports Medicine Awareness Course (SMAC)

A 2 hour practical workshop covering sports injury management and prevention techniques including warm-up and cool down tips.

Strap Smart - Taping Workshop \$50

This 2 hour practical workshop gives participants the basic skills and knowledge required to tape the ankle, thumb and fingers in order to help prevent sporting injuries.

Pre & Post Massage - Members \$130, Non-Members \$140 Prerequisite Level 1 Sports Trainer

An introduction to sports massage, designed to teach the basic massage techniques, before and after an event. Upon completion, course participants will be able to identify contra indications to massage; execute and know the different strokes and their uses in massage; use correct stance and posture; and safely and confidently execute a basic sports and relaxation massage.

Advanced Taping - Members \$130, Non-Members \$140

This course is a progression on the taping techniques taught in the sports trainer level 1 course. The course is 5 hours long run over 2 nights and techniques taught during the course include, achilles tendon, pelvic, shoulder, plantar fascia, AC joint and Elbow.

Spinal Management - Members \$130, Non-Members \$140

Taught in conjunction with Royal Life Saving Society, this course teaches the first responder how to assess and manage a potential spinal cord injury. Participants are taken through the application of cervical collars, spine boards and head beds. A prerequisite for this course is a Level 1 Sports Trainer qualification or other relevant experience.

Concussion & Head Injury in Sport

Interest in sports concussion has grown widely in the last two decades among parents, first aids. coaches and sports trainers. Significant contributions of evidence-based research have led to a better understanding of this injury. This information has transformed all aspects of concussion management, from on-field evaluation through return-to-play quidelines. The aim of this session is to educate all involved with sport on some of the important issues, outcome of research and treatment protocols.

Don't leave the fate of your athletes, children, self in the hands of others. Educate yourself on this issue and learn the evaluation, management guidelines, and return-to-play recommendations

Sport Injuredata Project

The SMA-ACT, UC Sport Injuredata Project will enable collection of high quality data on sports injuries during Sporting events and will provide the capacity for immediate modelling of trends and occurrence rates of injury.

SMA – ACT & UC partnership in Sports Injuredata project couples high level research and analysis skills with an existing sports coverage network allowing a high quality data collection.

Combining rigorous research and analysis, to provide evidence for safer participation and better injury prevention outcomes for ACT sport.

Sport Injuredata Project using the software Record Pro, will create the first regional electronic sports injury surveillance and reporting system of its kind. This system will collect data on sports injuries during events and will provide immediate modeling of trends and occurrence rates of injury across sports and venues. SMA-ACT Sports Trainers using this system will log injury and treatment data in real time on site via a menu prompt system to maximise quality of data recorded. This project is supported by ACT Government, and aligned to Initiative 1.1 of the ACT Sport & Recreation ACTIVE2020 Plan. Sports injuries are expensive and a detrimental to participants health. Injuries mean more sidelined players, lengthy rehabilitation and often poor team performance. It is crucial not to underestimate the importance of sport safety and the integral role Sport safety personnel (including sports trainers & sports first aiders) play in keeping sport safet, with injury recording a vital link in this process.

Sports First Aid Coverage

As an event organiser you are well aware of your legal liability and duty of care to both the participants and spectators. By having a dedicated team of professionals on hand, you can minimise risks and provide medical and first-aid treatment the moment an injury occurs. Our service is tailored to your event requirements and if necessary we can provide a team which includes doctors, nurses or just first aiders. Our first aiders have their own insurance and need to have a prerequisites of a level 1 sports trainers accreditation ensuring that your event has the best possible care and skilled personnel to meet any first aid emergency. All attending personnel have current CPR qualifications, are highly visible and can be mobile on foot, in car, on motor bike or in a boat if required.

SMA provides cover for a vast array of events ranging from small one off local events to mass participation events of a national and international standard.

Let Sports Medicine Australia organise our fully qualified personnel to attend your next event.

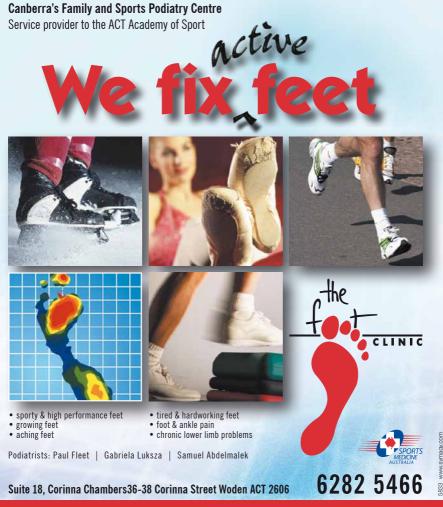
Application forms should be lodged at least four weeks prior to your event. Administration fee may be incurred if less than 4 weeks notice is given.

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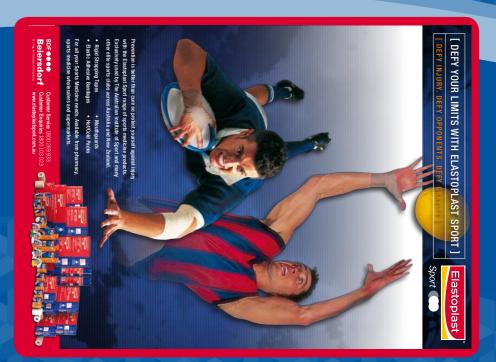
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
